From birth to age 5, children learn more than in any other period in their lives.



Here are some things you can do to help prevent violence:

- Do what you can to create a safe and loving environment
- Show your child nonviolent ways to resolve conflicts
- Praise your children when they solve problems without resorting to violence
- Let them know it's OK to walk away from a potentially violent situation

- Teach your child to stay calm, but to speak up or stand up for him or herself without anger, when conflicts arise
- Teach your child to respect and care about others
- Take a parenting class on non-violent ways to resolve conflicts
